



CODE OF CONDUCT FOR PARTICIPANTS

Mole Valley Orienteering Club is fully committed to safeguarding and promoting the well-being of all its members.

The Club believes that it is important that members, coaches, administrators and parents associated with the Club should, at all times, show respect for each other, be encouraged to be open at all times and to share any concerns or complaints that they may have about any aspect of the Club with the Designated Officer.

As a member of Mole Valley Orienteering Club you are expected to abide by the following club rules:

- All members must compete within the rules and respect officials and their decisions and adhere to the Code of Conduct of British Orienteering.
- All members must respect other competitors.
- Members should keep to agreed timings for training and competitions or inform their coach or team manager if they are going to be late.
- Members must wear suitable clothing for training and competition sessions, as agreed with the coach or captain.
- Members must pay any fees for training or events promptly.
- Members must follow British Orienteering rules.
- All members must treat the environment in which they compete or train with care and respect.

This Code of Conduct was adopted by Mole Valley Orienteering Club Committee and is effective from 4 October 2007.

The Designated Officer is currently the Master.
